TOWN BOARD MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cortlandville was held at the Village of McGraw Community Building, Clinton Street, McGraw, New York, with Supervisor Tupper presiding.

Supervisor Tupper called the meeting to order.

Councilman Withey made a motion, seconded by Councilman Testa, to approve the Town Board Minutes of April 4, 2018. All voting aye, the motion was carried.

The Town Board Minutes of April 18, 2018 were presented to the Board for their review.

Councilman Proud entered the meeting at 5:03 p.m.

Supervisor Tupper offered privilege of the floor to Melinda McCool.

Melinda McCool introduced herself as the Superintendent of McGraw High School. She prefaced her discussion with her personal history in McGraw. She relayed that she was born in Cortland County and graduated from McGraw High School, taught in the Homer school district for 14 years, was a principal for 10 years in the Catskills before ultimately returning to McGraw.

Ms. McCool illustrated that McGraw school district is growing as opposed to closing or consolidating as in other areas. She stated that the usual 520 students have increased to 575 students. She added the pre-k student count will be increasing as well. This growth has provoked an examination of the school budget. Ms. McCool gave the Town Board an overview of events and programs at McGraw High School. She commended McGraw teachers and credited them with the fact that McGraw High School has the highest rate of graduation in the county, which was 95% in 2017, and 71% percent of their students attended colleges. These statistics are well above the state averages. Their goal is for students to remain in New York State and to be productive members of society. She indicated in order to accomplish this goal, McGraw, with the aid of educational commissioners, is able to provide students with many different pathways to success. These include: CTE Pathway, which compensates technology pathways designed for technology applications; an internship program, where students attend summer school to work in technology and facilities departments learning how to form resumes, cover letters and communication skills; preparing students to be job ready for the students who go directly to work rather than college. She reported that next year they will introduce Agricultural Technology. She thanked Cortlandville for its concentration on Agricultural zoning in this regard. Ms. McCool indicated that AmeriCu bank has discussed partnering with the school on education pieces by putting a branch directly within the school, thus promoting an entrepreneur program. Ms. McCool depicted many avenues of promoting their goal in providing students with the skills to be job ready. She expressed her pride and excitement in being involved and thanked the community, county and McGraw school district voters for participating in the process. Ms. McCool passed out candy bars to those in attendance as her students designed the wrapper and submitted a 2017-2018 McGraw High Profile before thanking the Board for their time.

Supervisor Tupper offered privilege of the floor to Pam Jenkins.

Town resident, Pam Jenkins voiced her concerns regarding the Code Enforcement Office and the absence of a Conditional Permit Log being completed as it was done in the past. She mentioned the Planning Board Minutes of November 27, 2017 in which the Planning Board formally requested "that the Town Supervisor, PZO Bruce Weber, CEOs Kevin McMahon and Desiree Campbell convene a meeting to discuss who will be responsible for updating of the Planning Board's Conditional Permit Log."

Ms. Jenkins urged the Town Board to investigate this matter as it impacts several legal matters.

Supervisor Tupper offered privilege of the floor to Pat Leach.

Village of McGraw resident, Pat Leach thanked the Board for conducting the Town Board meeting in the Village of McGraw. Mr. Leach spoke in regard to possible upcoming budget cuts to Lamont Library and to the Village Recreation Department and implored the Board to continue to fight for funding. Mr. Leach asserted that the programs provide a safe alternative for our youth at school and throughout the summer. He indicated his own personal benefit from such programs and as a Cortlandville taxpayer, wished to see that funding continue. He expressed the hope that these potential cuts to library funding, which assist with academics, is not aiding in the funding for Gutchess Lumber Park. Mr. Leach thanked the Board for past funding and asked them to reconsider future funding for the Lamont Library and Recreation Department.

Supervisor Tupper offered privilege of the floor to Carole Preston.

Carole Preston introduced herself as a Lamont Free Library cardholder. She advised, as a taxpayer, she is very concerned that the only option presented, in regards to funding for the library, is to double the taxes for Village residents in order to compensate for the \$27,000 stipend that Cortlandville may no longer fund. She emphasized that McGraw is part of Cortlandville and the Lamont Free Library is available to everyone. She stated her understanding is that a portion of the taxes she pays goes toward funding the Cortlandville Fire Department. She suggested that perhaps that portion could be redirected to the library. She professed she is against raising taxes for any reason and that she fears an increase in taxes will promote continual increases in the future. Ms. Preston suggested alternative ways to generate revenue for the library such as reaching out to area businesses for financial support or various fund raising activities.

Supervisor Tupper responded to the comments made under privilege of the floor. He reported that the only outside contract that the Town of Cortlandville did not cut in 2018 was the Lamont Free Library. He continued that the contract was funded in exactly the amount that was requested. He explained that recreation funding was cut for Cortland, Homer and McGraw

programs in order to stay within the New York State 2 % tax cap. He said the Town has been very generous in the past, but unfortunately the Town was forced to reduce expenses. Supervisor Tupper encouraged residents to disregard rumors and reminded those in attendance that the 2019 budget process has not yet begun. He also remarked that the Cortlandville Fire Department is independent from the Town and has their own budget. The only residents that pay a fire district tax are those who live outside the Village.

Supervisor Tupper addressed Pam Jenkins in regards to her concern with a conditional permit log. He explained the Planning Board has asked the Town to reconfigure a form devised years ago, and confirmed the Board is studying it.

Attorney Folmer interjected explaining there was a difference of opinion as to what purpose the conditional permit log serves. He stated that although a Planning Board member felt the purpose of the log was to track the conditions that were attached to the granting of a permit and were being complied with over the course of time, Zoning Officer Bruce Weber indicated the log was intended to decide if a building or conditional permit has been issued. In the event that in the course of an annual or biannual fire inspection wasn't correct, then it would be reported back. There is a difference of opinion in definition and all parties concerned are working to resolve the lack of understanding.
